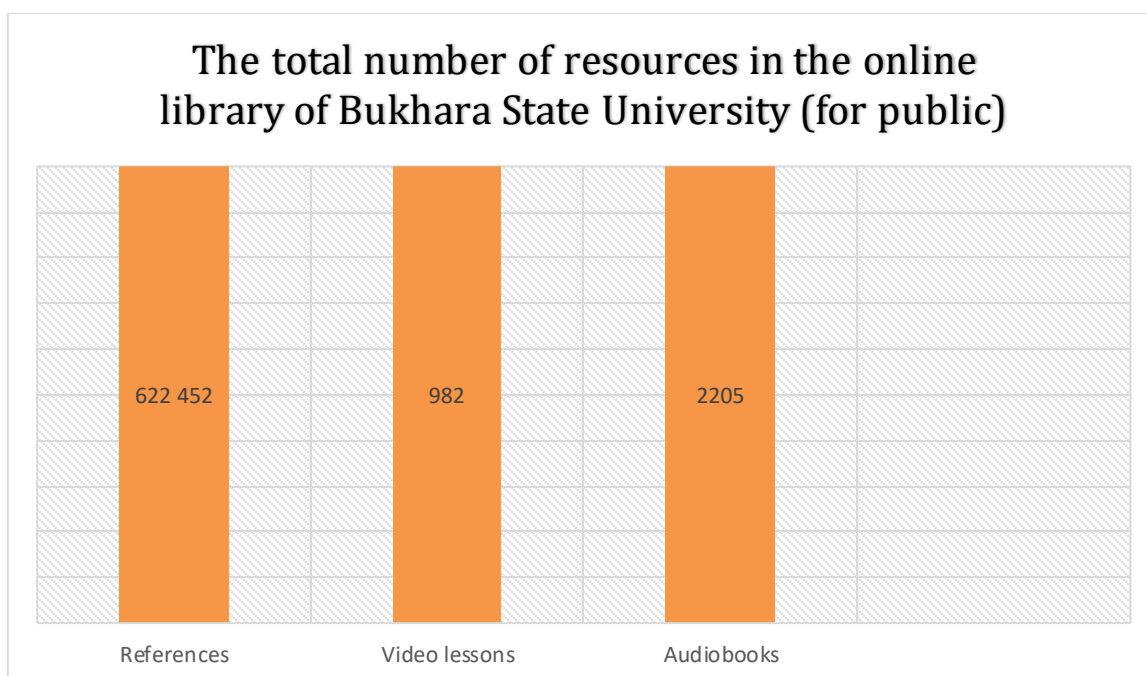

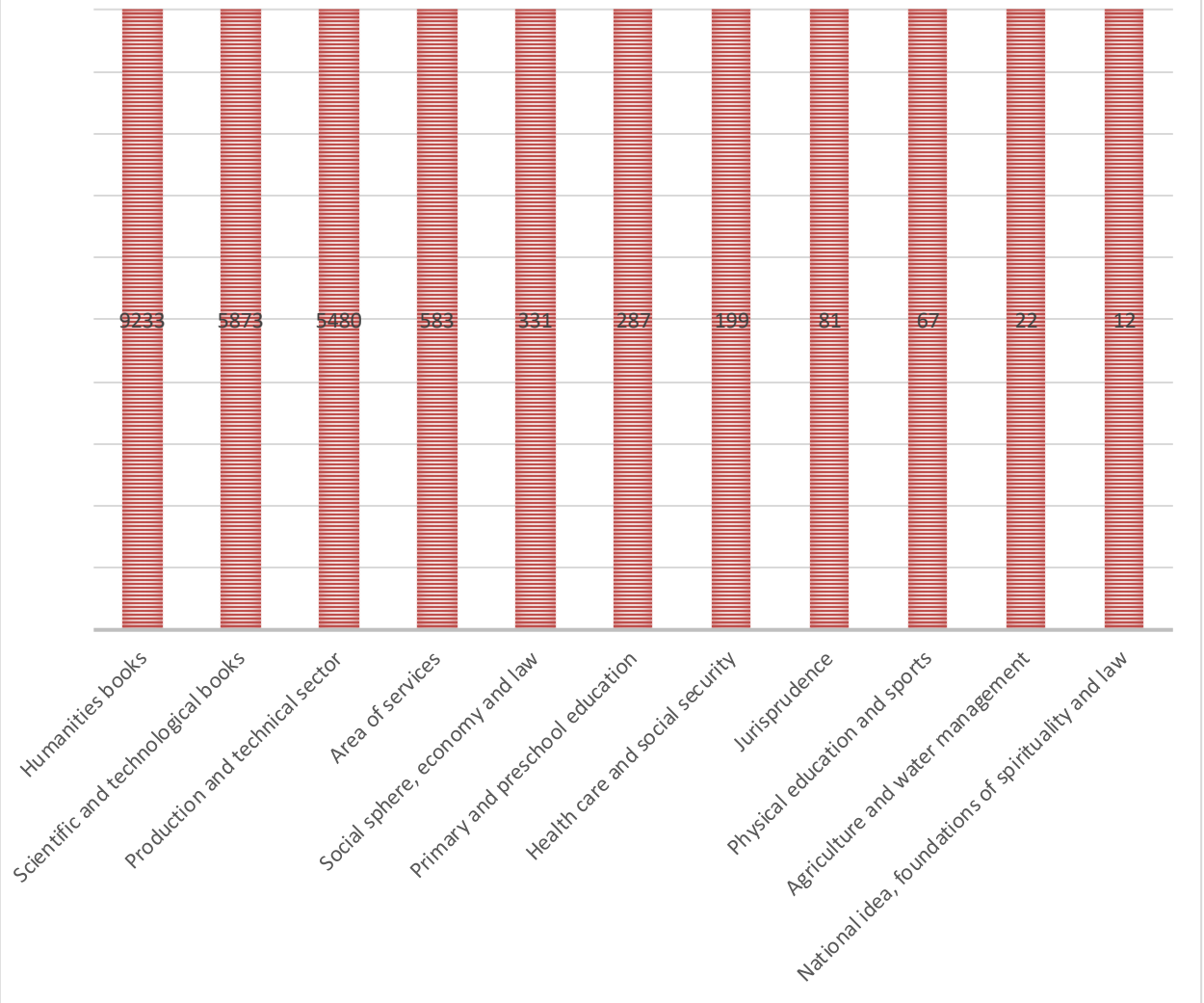

## Support of Art and Heritage: Public access to libraries, museums, buildings

Bukhara State University gives access to its buildings, museums and library to all citizens. There are three buildings on the main campus two more in different campus. People who do not study at Bukhara State University have a very convenient access to educational resources. Because the official library of Bukhara State University (<http://elib.buxdu.uz/index.php>) contain the resources of all subjects online. Here the educational resources in Uzbek, Russian and English languages can be easily used. In addition, 1<sup>st</sup> floor of the center is supplied with about 100 computers which can be used for searching information not only from university base but also from other online libraries. Moreover, users can also watch the videos of many lessons in 3 languages (Uzbek, Russian and English) (<http://elib.buxdu.uz/index.php/videodarslar>).

In addition, non-university students can use Information Resource Centers free of charge. The general fund of the Information Resource Center consists of 64,678 titles and 481,051 copies. Textbooks in 2155 titles, 45157 copies, educational manuals in 2904 titles, 119889 copies, fiction literature in 29733 titles, 138910 copies, scientific literature in 11515 titles in 68512 copies, electronic literature in 43064 titles, 47287 copies, other available literature in 18371 titles, 108583 copies.

In 2022, 838 copies of newspapers in 24 titles and 28 copies of magazines in 24 titles were subscribed. Rare books in the IRC, including rare and especially valuable publications, are stored in appropriate conditions. That is, they are kept in a separate room with normal light, temperature and humidity. There are a total of 25 eastern manuscripts, including 108 lithographs, in the IRC fund.

The university subscribes to international scientific databases such as EBSCO, SCOPUS, Web of Science, ProQuist, ScienceDirect. Professors, teachers, doctoral students, masters and non-university students who are engaged in scientific activities can use these databases.

1. Scientific-methodological and informational department.

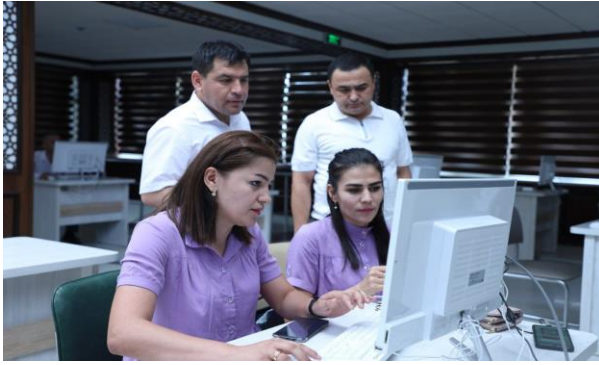
2. Information-library resource integration, cataloging and systematization department.

There two museums on the university campus which are open to public. On the initiative of A.A.Tolaganov, former rector of Bukhara State University, a scientific-practical museum-laboratory was established as a celebration of the 85th anniversary of the university. The exhibits and equipment of this museum were formed on the basis of the exhibits of the previous museum of the university. In order to enrich the contents of the museum and organize it based on the requirements of the times, the scientific base was updated on the basis of a modern base in cooperation with all faculties.

According to the decision of the Cabinet of Ministers of the Republic of Uzbekistan No. 936 dated November 22, 2017, it was decided to establish a museum of memory of the victims of repression in the structure of universities in all regions. On May 18, 2018 Bukhara State University also held a ceremonial opening ceremony of the Repression Victims' Memorial Museum in Bukhara State University. The museum consists of 3 halls and covers the period from 1865 to the present day. The exposition of the museum includes artifacts of the 19th century, valuable archival documents, photo and film documents. The exhibition called "Islam Karimov in memory of the Bukharans" is also located in the Independence Hall. These background and documentary materials were prepared in cooperation with the scientific and educational memorial complex named after



the First President of the Republic of Uzbekistan Islam Karimov under the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan.

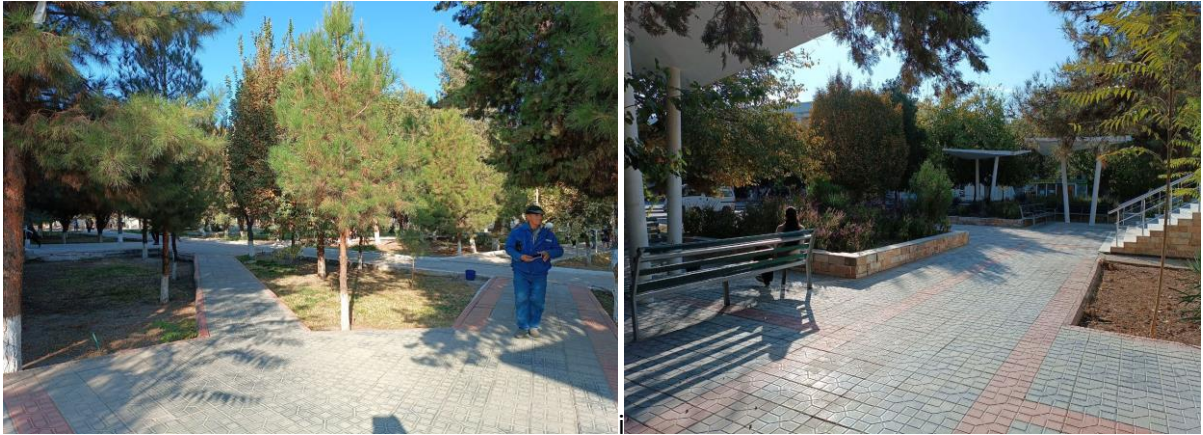


All green spaces of university campus is open for public. Moreover, university initiates and supports projects of "Green Spaces". According to the data, in the following years, an average of 400-500 kg of a mixture of dust and salts will fall on each hectare of the Bukhara region only through the atmosphere, 40-50 percent of which will come from the Aral region. Natural moisture is not enough in our region, the annual amount of atmospheric precipitation is 90-150 mm, and evaporation from the ground level reaches 2000 mm. In this respect, Bukhara region belongs to the extremely dry (arid) zone.



In order to reduce the negative impact of dust, dust and salts entering the regions of our region due to strong dust and sand storms and winds - greening, planting trees and creating a healthy ecological environment, Professor Obidjon Khamidov, Rector of Bukhara State University and With the initiatives of the head of the biology department, professor Askar Holliyev, February 2021-2022 was declared as the month of planting saplings on the scale of both districts in order to mitigate the negative effects of the above adverse environmental factors in the Olot and Karakol districts of the region.

There is a parking lot for cars and there is a pedestrian priority on campus.



#### Arts and heritage contribution

Bukhara State University has formed collaboration with other organizations in the field of art. To be specific, in 2021 following collaborative contracts were realized:



1. Secondary school specialized in art of maqom (type of native music) named after Abdurauf Fitrat, Ministry of Culture of Republic of Uzbekistan
2. Department of culture of Bukhara region, Uzbekistan
3. Secondary school of music and art № 5, Bukhara city

5. Secondary school of music and art № 4, Bukhara city
6. Secondary school "Barkamol avlod" (Mature generation)

Affordable housing for teachers

Accommodation for 24 employees in the Building 7 and 20 employees in the Building 6 is provided.



Affordable housing for students

Bukhara State University has 7 student accommodation buildings, with a total of 2508 places for students. Buildings 1-6 have a capacity of 340 places, a total of 2020 places, building 7 has a capacity of 488 places. Each building has a 3-bed room for disabled students.

Dormitory buildings have a total of 64 kitchens, 128 electric stoves and 1 refrigerator in each kitchen, a total of 64 units. 13 modern washing machines are installed in 8 laundry rooms. There are 72 irons in 12 ironing rooms. Toilets and washrooms (showers) have been established and are operating on each floor of the buildings. There are 33 modern computers connected to the Internet in the lobby of the student residence. There is one on each floor of the building and a total of 30 televisions in the foyers. Common areas are organized on each floor of the dormitory buildings.

Students can register from home - remotely through this <http://uniwork.buxdu.uz/yotoqxona.asp> platform system by submitting an application for placement at dormitory (computer service for registration at dormitory itself is also provided);

2. The amount of 1 month's payment for living in the dormitory was set at 193,000 soums;

3. ALOQA BANK mobile cash register payment system was established in dormitory itself so that students do not have to travel far and waste time. In this case, the student can make the payment freely, easily and quickly right there.
